DPW Water Main Replacement Work

As many of you are aware, water main replacement work continues on several streets within the Hillen Community. The 1500-1600 blocks of Cold Spring Lane, 4000-4200 blocks of Loch Raven, and the 1500 block of Sheffield Road have had disruption over the past several weeks. Other streets in our community will be affected in the coming months. Those streets include: Argonne, Kingsway, Lochwood, Northwick, Northgate, Ralworth, Shadyside, Roundhill Roads. We are trying to get information from the DPW Project Manager as to when water main replacement work is projected to begin on the streets listed above. We have invited the Project Manager to our March 23rd community meeting to answer questions that residents may have about work to be done,

Weekly Recycling Is Coming Back To Baltimore City

The pandemic took an immeasurable toll on our city, including disruptions to many basic services that we all rely on to keep our neighborhoods clean.

Earlier last month, Mayor Brandon Scott shared that *starting the first full week of March recycling will return to Baltimore City weekly* --another milestone in efforts to put Baltimore City back on track.

This significant development is the result of extensive efforts across my Administration, bolstered by strategic investments in personnel and equipment to help make recycling easier and more reliable in every neighborhood. \sim



Youth Works Applications Now Open Until March 22, 2024

YouthWorks 2024 will operate a 5-week summer program for youth from Monday, July 8^{th} - Friday, August 9^{th} . Youth may work up to five hours per day and five days per week totaling 25 hours (may work more hours in Private Sector). Pay has increased to \$15/hour. HB332/SB357 Hearing – Baltimore City Out of State Vehicle: Improper Registration

Our neighboring 4th District Councilman, Mark Conway, submitted testimony for *HB332/SB357*, introduced by Delegate Jackie Addison and Senator Cory McCray, District 45. This bill would authorize the City to tow, remove, or impound a vehicle owned by a new resident of Maryland who fails to register the vehicle with the Motor Vehicle Administration and display valid registration plates issued by the MVA within 60 days of their move into the state.

In the 4th District, and in Baltimore City as a whole, vehicles with out-of-state plates speed through red lights, accrue hundreds of dollars in speeding camera tickets, and take away street parking spaces from law-abiding constituents. Councilman Conway indicates these drivers are often Maryland residents who have discovered they can game the system by purchasing out-of-state plates or not changing their out-of-state tags when they move to the state. This bill would close the loophole, and these changes have the potential to dramatically curb issues we see with ticket reciprocity, unpaid fines, and insurance claims.
