## **3<sup>rd</sup> District News (Councilman Dorsey)**

### **Permanent Bike Lanes/ Bills on Sidewalk Repairs & Ban Gas-Powered Leaf Blowers**

Good news! In May, DOT and I applied for State funding to plan to make bike lanes on Harford permanent with concrete instead of flex posts. Fortunately, MD's Department of Transportation recently made their annual bikeways and transportation alternative grants available. I worked to put together an application with the city's department of transportation and - in a very competitive year - we got it! **We were successful in being awarded \$96k to begin design work to transition Harford Road's bike lanes into a more attractive, safer and permanent form.** Nobody loves flex posts, and we have always discussed the current form as a first iteration. This funding will help us prepare to bring about that next iteration.

**In other news,** I recently passed a bill improving and clarifying processes related to sidewalk repairs that property owners pay for. Our understanding of those opportunities and need for improvement was the result of convening DOT, the BMZA and Law staff regularly for many months.

This week I met again with the group to make sure changes have been implemented smoothly and that we are seeing the bill's beneficial outcomes. At Monday's City Council meeting my bill to ban the use of gas-powered leaf blowers advanced on 2nd reader with a 10-5 vote and will come to a final vote at the next meeting. Every week we take a couple more steps in the right direction, and I'm grateful for it. I hope you have a great weekend! (3<sup>rd</sup> District Weekly: 9/13/2024)
